ECTA, the European Chemical Transport Association, has secured funding for the development of its mobile phone app for drivers. ECTA's Driver Shortage Workgroup has pinpointed excessive waiting times and poor facilities at loading and unloading sites as a major factor in reducing the attractiveness of truck driving as a profession, hindering the recruitment and retention of drivers.

It suggested developing a system that would make it easy for drivers to report poor conditions, with the aim of improving standards. Drivers will be able to rate each site on the basis of safety, waiting time, driver treatment, driver facilities and total residence time. Work on the ECTA app is now starting.
